There is a concerted effort by the State and County in many cases to reduce the cost of providing services to seniors and people with disabilities; and

If the client is capable of self-direction, he or she in many cases, is deemed no longer eligible for protective supervision; and

WHEREAS:

This is an important issue for UDW and those we care for because a lack of protective supervision can lead to the denial of services for seniors and people with disabilities and jeopardize their safety. People with disabilities and seniors are supported in their full development with protective supervision.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That UDW/AFSCME Local 3930 make it a priority to change the regulations for protective supervision to be more inclusive of all seniors and people with disabilities and their needs.
